

Josh Sinton is a Brooklyn-based baritone saxophonist, bass clarinetist and creative musician. He is part of the renaissance of creative activity that has been happening over the past 15 years in Brooklyn that includes musicians such as Mary Halvorson, Nate Wooley, Travis Laplante and Ingrid Laubrock. Currently he leads the band Predicate Trio as well as collaborating with Guillermo Gregorio in a duo and Todd Neufeld and Giacomo Meregá in a trio. He founded and led the Steve Lacy-repertory band Ideal Bread as well as the trio musicianer in addition to performing solo material on the baritone saxophone. He is a long-standing member of the Nate Wooley Quintet and Anthony Braxton's Tri-Centric Orchestra and spent many years as a member of Darcy James Argue's Secret Society. Since arriving in New York City in 2004, he has worked with a wide cross section of the city's musical community including John Zorn, Vijay Iyer, Nico Muhly, Andrew D'Angelo and Megan Schubert. He has also contributed essays to the Brooklyn Rail, SoundAmerican.org, Do The Math and Darcy James Argue's Secret Society.
